Gaellen Quinn, author of “The Last Aloha”



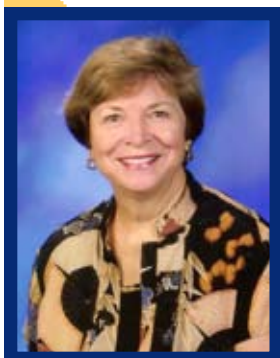
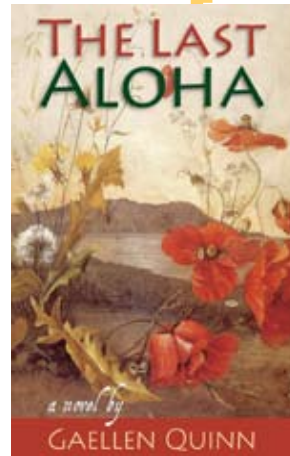
